## Acceptance Agreement

## General Terms and Conditions of Award

- The School of Information Systems (SIS) Achievements Scholarship is a financial award ("Award") tenable only at the Singapore Management University ("University").
- The Award is valued at \$10,000 ("Sum") per annum and tenable for up to four (4) years of the Recipient's studies in a Bachelor of Science undergraduate programme ("Programme") offered by the School of Information Systems ("SIS") at the University.
- 3 The Recipient must not hold any other awards of a similar nature during the tenure of the Award, except with the prior approval of the University.
- The continued tenure or renewal of the Award will be at the sole discretion of the University and is subject to the Recipient:
  - (a) consistently maintaining a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.20;
  - (b) demonstrating exemplary conduct embodying the SMU CIRCLE Values of Commitment, Integrity, Responsibility, Collegiality, Leadership and Excellence and complying with the University's prevailing code of conduct and other rules and regulations applicable to the Recipient;
  - (c) fulfilling the terms and conditions set out herein and/or such other terms and conditions as may be advised by the University in writing from time to time; and
  - (d) fulfilling the obligations (if any) as stated in the offer communicated through electronic mail or printed letter.
- 5 The Sum shall be applied in the following manner:
  - (a) \$8,000 of the annual sum shall be disbursed to the Recipient via interbank giro credit transfer, details of which the Recipient may register or update via OASIS > Self-service App – Maintain Bank Accounts (select "Receiving Bank Account Details"), in two equal instalments by week 7 of Term 1 and Term 2 in meeting his or her tuition fee, living expenses and/or study-related expenses.
  - (b) The remaining sum after Clause 5 (a) will be applied towards the payment of tuition fee in two equal instalments for Term 1 and Term 2 with any shortfall in tuition fee not adequately covered by the Award shall be of the Recipient's responsibility to settle.
- If the Recipient is a Singaporean student, the receipt of this Award does not restrict him or her in applying to the University for a bursary for cash allowance to further support shortfall in tuition fee payable and/or estimated living expenses during the tenure of the Award should his or her family financial circumstance necessitates him or her to do so and subject to him or her fulfilling the bursary eligibility criteria. However, if the Recipient has been granted the living allowance component of the Study Loan for his or her course of study, the living allowance shall not be disbursed during the tenure of this Award.
- 7 The University will reserve the right to revoke the Award in any of the following circumstances:
  - (a) Recipient prematurely withdraws from the Programme or if his or her enrollment in the Programme is otherwise terminated for any reason.
  - (b) The conduct of the Recipient brings ill repute to the University.
  - (c) The Recipient commits any disciplinary offence under the University's policies.
  - (d) The Recipient has been convicted by a court of law in any country during the Programme, of an offence involving dishonesty or moral turpitude.

- (e) The candidature of the Recipient as a student in the University is terminated or suspended for any reason.
- (f) The Recipient has abandoned any part of the Programme before the completion thereof without justifiable cause, or in any way renders himself or herself unable or unsuitable to pursue the Programme to its completion.
- (g) The Recipient has breached the requirements of Clause 4.
- In the event that the Award is revoked on the grounds set out in Clause 7 above, including the situation where the Recipient withdraws from the Programme or the University, the Recipient may be required, at the absolute discretion of the Dean of Students or the Dean of SIS at the University to pay liquidated damages of an amount equivalent to the total sum disbursed under the Award at the time of the termination or withdrawal, as the case may be, together with interest thereon at the compounded rate of 5% per annum to the University within 30 days of revocation of the Award.
- For the avoidance of doubt, the Recipient shall not have any right or claim as against the University in the event that the Award is revoked in accordance with Clauses 7 and 8 hereof.
- 10 Unless otherwise stated in the letter of offer or any other communication to the Recipient, there is no bond attached to the Award.
- The Recipient is required to take advantage of the Tuition Grant Scheme (TGS), a scheme offered by the Singapore Government to subsidise the cost of tertiary education in Singapore. In exchange for the Government subsidy received under the TGS, if the Recipient is a non-Singaporean student (including Singapore Permanent Resident), he or she is required to sign a Tuition Grant agreement in which he or she will be contractually obliged to work in Singapore-based companies for a minimum period of three (3) years upon graduation.
- 12 The terms and conditions herein may from time to time be reviewed and amended by the University.
